Register Now for Harford's First Annual Youth and Family Resource Festival Coming Saturday April 22

BEL AIR, Md., (March 15, 2017) - Registration is now open for Harford County's first annual Youth and Family Resource Festival featuring public and private resources for youth of all abilities from birth to young adults. Developed by the Harford County Department of Community Services' Local Management Board and Office of Disability Services, this free, family-friendly event will be held on Saturday, April 22 from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. at APGFCU Arena located at Harford Community College, 401 Thomas Run Road in Bel Air. Dozens of workshops, more than 80 exhibitors, and a kid zone are planned. Free bus transportation will be available from designated locations, and a light lunch will be provided for citizens who register in advance.

"This unprecedented local event will help connect children and young adults of all abilities with resources in our community," said County Executive Barry Glassman. "I encourage families to register now and join us on April 22 for this first annual festival to lift up Harford County's next generation."

Thirty-six workshops scheduled throughout the day for children, youth, and parents will offer information including kindergarten readiness, yoga and music for young children, homework strategies, library resources, healthy eating, healthy relationships, mental health and well-

Festival attendees will also have the opportunity to meet with exhibitors and representatives from vendors, agencies, organizations, and support groups that provide services such as summer camps, tutoring, behavioral health, fingerprinting, preschool programs, athletic programs, financial assistance and housing support. There will also be youth entertainment and interactive experiences including a Touch-a-Truck experience with a police car and a fire truck, face painting, Chesapeake Therapeutic Riding's Equicizer mechanical horse, and Disney princess characters to meet and greet! Door prizes from organizations such as Chick-fil-A, Saxon's Diamond Centers, and the Michael Stewart Foundation will be awarded throughout the day.
