Frank is a worldwide speaker, presenting seminars to parents, educators and child-serving professionals on topics including brain-based learning, attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD), neuroscience of the teenage brain and brain-compatible organizational leadership. He also speaks on the effects of stress, child abuse and poverty in relation to brain function and development. Frank has presented at national education, social work and human services conferences, and he has been awarded a Maryland Governor's Citation for his speaking efforts. In addition to lecturing nationwide, Frank co-authored two books: *Creating the Upside Down Organization: Transforming Staff to Save Troubled Children* and *The Upside Down Organization: Reinventing Group Care*. Frank holds a bachelor's degree in psychology from Creighton University, a master's degree in social work from the University of Nebraska-Omaha and a law degree from Notre Dame Law School.



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
