A BILL to authorize and empower Harford County, Maryland to borrow, on its full faith and credit, and issue and sell its bonds or other evidences of indebtedness (including lease financing), in an amount not to exceed Fifty-Five Million Five Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$55,580,000.00) principal amount, the proceeds thereof to be used for the expansion, reconstruction, rehabilitation, renovation and improvement of certain projects as described in the Annual Budget and Appropriation Ordinance, Bill No. 20-009, as amended, for the year ending June 30, 2021 and as described in this Bill in accordance with Section 524 of the Charter of Harford County and Section 123-40 of the Code of Harford County or as otherwise permitted by law; authorizing the County Council of Harford County, Maryland (the "County Council") to adopt an administrative resolution that shall provide for the form of instrument by which any indebtedness is to be evidenced, the manner by which bonds and any other indebtedness may be secured and the rate(s) of interest to be paid, and generally for such other matters as may be deemed appropriate by the County Council in connection therewith and authorizing the County Council by administrative resolution or the County Executive of Harford County, Maryland (the "County Executive") by executive order to determine the form of various documents as are necessary or desirable to implement the financing authorized herein, the manner of issuance and delivery of any bonds or any other evidences of indebtedness, the payment of all necessary expenses in connection therewith, the method by which bonds or any other evidences of indebtedness shall be sold, maturity schedule, and redemption provisions; authorizing the appointment of certain agents; and otherwise generally relating to the issuance, sale, delivery and payment of bonds or any other evidences of indebtedness; providing that bonds or any other indebtedness shall be issued upon the full faith and credit and taxing power of Harford County, Maryland; providing for the issuance of bond anticipation notes (or other form of indebtedness) upon adoption of an administrative resolution by the County Council approving the interest rate or rates to be borne thereby for all or a portion of the projects described herein, for which the proceeds of sale of the bond anticipation notes shall be used; providing that after the issuance of the bond anticipation notes (or other form of indebtedness), or any renewal thereof, the County Council shall authorize the issuance of bonds to pay said bond anticipation notes (or other form of indebtedness); providing that upon written recommendation of the County Executive and administrative resolution of the County Council, all or a portion of the indebtedness authorized herein intended to be utilized for programs or projects for managing, producing, treating, recapturing, abating or controlling nonpoint sources of water pollution, including storm water or subsurface drainage water, included among the projects described in Section 1 of this Bill, may be incurred pursuant to loans from the Maryland Water Quality Financing Administration; providing for disbursement of the proceeds of the sale of bonds or other indebtedness authorized

1 herein and for the levying of charges, assessments and all taxes necessary to provide payment of
2 the principal of and premium (if any) and interest on bonds or other form of indebtedness;
3 providing that certain additional matters may be determined by resolution of the County Council
4 or may be reserved unto the County Executive as prescribed by such resolution; providing the
5 method of fixing the interest rates to be borne by such bonds and generally providing for and
6 determining various matters in connection therewith; and generally relating to funding of the
7 projects described herein.

1 WHEREAS, among other State of Maryland and local laws, Section 524 of the Charter of
2 Harford County, Maryland (the “Charter”) and Section 123-40 of the County Code of Harford
3 County, Maryland (the “Code”) authorize Harford County, Maryland (the “County”) to incur
4 long-term indebtedness; and

5 WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 406 of the Charter, the Director
6 of Planning has heretofore transmitted to the County Executive of Harford County, Maryland
7 (the “County Executive”) the recommendations of the Planning and Advisory Board for certain
8 capital improvements; and

9 WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 505 of the Charter, the County
10 Executive has reviewed such recommendations in light of the existing capital programs and the
11 County Executive and the Director of Administration of the County (the “Director of
12 Administration”) have included such recommendations for capital improvements, as may be
13 amended, in the proposed Capital Program that has been submitted to the County Council of
14 Harford County, Maryland (the “County Council”) and the County Council, after written
15 recommendation of the County Executive, public hearing and affirmative vote of at least four (4)
16 members of the County Council, has adopted the Capital Program (the “Capital Program”) and
17 Capital Budget (the “Capital Budget”) for the year ending June 30, 2021, pursuant to Bill No. 20-
18 009; and

19 WHEREAS, upon request of the County Executive and resolution of the County Council,
20 the County may sell bond anticipation notes in an amount not greater than the amount of bonds
21 authorized herein, in anticipation of the subsequent sale of the bonds, for all or a portion of the
22 cost of the Projects (defined herein) in accordance with the provisions of, Sections 19-211
23 through 19-221 of the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland (2013
24 Replacement Volume and 2019 Supplement); and

1 WHEREAS, as a part of the Capital Program and the Capital Budget, it is necessary that
2 the County borrow a sum not exceeding Fifty-Five Million Five Hundred Eighty Thousand
3 Dollars (\$55,580,000.00) to be used to finance the cost of the acquisition, construction,
4 reconstruction, improvement, extension, site acquisition, architectural and engineering services,
5 and furnishings and equipment for the Projects, including financial, legal and planning expenses
6 related thereto; and

7 WHEREAS, Section 520 of the Charter requires that the County Council authorize the
8 indebtedness described herein by legislative act and Section 524 of the Charter and other
9 applicable provisions of law provide for the incurrence of indebtedness on the faith and credit of
10 the County and the annual levy of *ad valorem* taxes upon the assessable property within the
11 County sufficient, together with other taxes and other available funds, to provide for the payment
12 of the principal of, premium (if any) and interest on any bonds or other indebtedness issued by
13 the County hereunder; and

14 WHEREAS, the proposed bonds or other indebtedness is within the legal limitation on
15 the indebtedness of the County; and

16 WHEREAS, it is necessary to provide funds for the construction, reconstruction,
17 improvement, extension, acquisition, alteration, repair and modernization, the cost of acquiring
18 any sites, making site improvements, architectural and engineering services, including
19 preparation of plans, drawings and specifications, the development of the grounds and
20 landscaping thereof, financial, legal and planning expenses and all customary appurtenances and
21 equipment for the Projects; and

22 WHEREAS, the financing or indebtedness herein authorized, including the aggregate
23 principal amount of bonds or other indebtedness in an amount not to exceed Fifty-Five Million
24 Five Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$55,580,000.00), and interest rate(s) to be borne

1 thereby, shall be evidenced and incurred pursuant to an administrative resolution to be adopted
2 by the County Council upon written recommendation of the County Executive, pursuant to this
3 Bill and other terms of sale, including, but not limited to maturity schedules, redemption
4 provisions, form of bond, and date of sale shall be determined by administrative resolution of the
5 County Council or executive order of the County Executive, as hereinafter set forth.

6 NOW, THEREFORE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE
7 CHARTER, THE CODE AND THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND:

8 **SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF HARFORD**
9 **COUNTY, MARYLAND** that, acting pursuant to the authority of the Charter, the Code and the
10 laws of the State of Maryland, Harford County, Maryland (the “County”) hereby authorizes and
11 approves the incurrence of debt or the payment of purchase price or rental installments for the
12 purpose of financing all or a portion of the cost of capital equipment, improvements, extensions,
13 modifications, alterations, or any combination thereof to the property of the County, together
14 with the acquisition of all necessary property rights, and all related architectural, financial, legal,
15 planning, design and engineering expenses associated with such capital equipment,
16 improvements, extensions, modifications or alterations for the following:

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All of the above are herein collectively referred to as the “Projects.”

The principal amount of indebtedness to be incurred hereunder shall not exceed Fifty-Five Million Five Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$55,580,000.00).

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND that prior to the issuance, sale and delivery of any bonds or other evidences of indebtedness in reliance on this Bill, the County Council shall (without limitation) determine by administrative resolution:

(a) the form of instruments and agreements by which the debt authorized herein shall be evidenced (including, but not limited to, bonds, bond anticipation notes, notes or other form of indebtedness, book entry, community participation bonds, letters of credit, trust agreements, trust indentures, financing or installment purchase lease or similar financing

1 agreement, or participation in any “bond bank” or bond pooling arrangement administered by the
2 State of Maryland or a subsidiary entity of it);

3 (b) the manner, if any, by which any indebtedness shall be secured (to the
4 extent annual debt service exceeds proceeds from recordation tax to be used pursuant to Section
5 12-113(a) of the Tax-Property Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland (2012 Replacement
6 Volume and 2019 Supplement) to pay school bonds issued on the faith and credit of the County
7 after January 1, 1959, and for other school purposes, or transfer tax proceeds to be used for
8 school construction and site acquisition pursuant to Bill No. 93-3 enacted by the County Council
9 on April 6, 1993 (and signed by the County Executive on April 20, 1993), as amended, and Bill
10 No. 07-05 enacted by the County Council on April 10, 2007 (and signed by the County Executive
11 on April 11, 2017), effective on June 10, 2007, including, but not limited to, a letter or letters of
12 credit, bond or other such insurance and a pledge of the full faith and credit and unlimited taxing
13 power of the County):

14 (c) the rate or rates of interest or method of determining such rate or rates; and

15 (d) whether the financing is to be accomplished by public sale, private
16 (negotiated) sale or by private placement.

17 (e) In the event the County determines to incur part or all of the indebtedness
18 pursuant to a lease or lease purchase arrangement, the County Council shall determine by
19 administrative resolution, the equipment to be subject to the lease and the lessor or lessors shall
20 be determined and approved by administrative resolution by the County Council after a bid
21 process conducted by the Department of the Treasury of the County. The County Council shall
22 also determine by administrative resolution whether or not the lease payments under the lease
23 shall be guaranteed by the full faith and credit and unlimited taxing power of the County or
24 whether the lease payments are subject to annual appropriation by the County Council each year.

1 Any resolution adopted by the County Council under, pursuant to or in accordance with
2 this Bill shall be deemed to be of an administrative nature and shall be effective upon the date
3 specified therein.

4 **SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL**
5 **OF HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that the County Council shall also by administrative
6 resolution determine the following matters:

7 (a) the principal amounts, date, denominations, interest payment dates,
8 maturity payment provisions and prepayment, tender and/or redemption provisions (if any) and
9 other terms and conditions thereof;

10 (b) the substantially final form and contents and consent to the distribution
11 (and shall authorize the execution and delivery, where applicable) of various agreements and
12 documents as are necessary to incur the indebtedness authorized herein, including, but not
13 limited to, a Preliminary Official Statement and/or an Official Statement, and in the event any
14 evidence of indebtedness is sold through competitive bidding, a Notice of Sale, and in the event
15 any evidence of indebtedness is sold by private (negotiated) sale, a Purchase Contract with the
16 underwriter(s) thereof, and if any indebtedness is issued in book entry form, securities depository
17 agreements (collectively the “Documents”) required for the issuance, sale and delivery of any
18 evidence of indebtedness authorized herein, which Documents shall contain such provisions as
19 may be required by law or determined by the County Council to consummate the financing
20 authorized herein;

21 (c) the manner in which any evidence of indebtedness shall be executed,
22 sealed and attested (which may be by facsimile signature and/or seal);

23 (d) provision for the payment of all necessary expenses of preparing, printing
24 and selling any evidence of indebtedness and the Documents including, without limitation, any

1 and all costs, fees and expenses incurred by or on behalf of the County in connection with the
2 authorization, issuance, sale and delivery of any indebtedness, and all costs incurred in
3 connection with the development of the Documents, including the fees of counsel to the County,
4 and compensation to any persons (other than full-time employees of the County) or entities
5 performing services for or on behalf of the County in connection therewith and in connection
6 with all other transactions contemplated by this Bill regardless of whether the proposed financing
7 is consummated;

8 (e) the name or designation of the indebtedness, provided that unless
9 otherwise designated, the indebtedness shall be known as Harford County, Maryland General
10 Obligation Bonds, Series 2021;

11 (f) such other matters in connection with the consummation of the financing
12 transactions contemplated by this Bill as may be deemed appropriate by the County Executive,
13 including (without limitation) the appointment of agents (including, but not limited to, trustees,
14 paying agents, indexing agents and/or registrars) in connection with the financing, the execution,
15 acknowledgment, sealing and delivery of such other and further agreements, documents and
16 instruments, and the authorization of the officials of the County to take any and all actions, as are
17 or may be necessary or appropriate to consummate the transactions contemplated by this Bill in
18 accordance with the terms hereof and of any administrative resolution adopted by the County
19 Council under, pursuant to or in accordance with this Bill.

20 (g) Without limiting the foregoing, the County Council may provide by
21 administrative resolution that any or all of the determinations described in this Section 3 may be
22 made by executive order of the County Executive with the same force and effect as if made by
23 the County Council in accordance with an administrative resolution. In addition, any other
24 matters described in this Bill that may be determined by either administrative resolution of the

1 County Council or executive order of the County Executive shall be determined by
2 administrative resolution of the County Council unless the County Council expressly provides
3 otherwise by an administrative resolution that such matters may be determined by executive
4 order of the County Executive.

5 **SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL**
6 **OF HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that authority is hereby conferred on the County
7 Executive, the Director of Administration, the Treasurer of the County (the “Treasurer”), the
8 County Attorney of the County and the Council Administrator of the County Council, or any of
9 them, and they are each hereby directed to take the following actions on behalf of the County:

10 (a) to execute, acknowledge, seal and deliver the Documents substantially in
11 the forms determined by administrative resolution of the County Council or executive order of
12 the County Executive; and

13 (b) to execute, acknowledge, seal and deliver such other and further
14 certificates, certifications, agreements, documents and instruments and take such other acts as
15 they or any one or more of them may deem necessary or appropriate to consummate the
16 transactions contemplated by this Bill in accordance with the provisions hereof and of any
17 resolution adopted by the County Council or executive order issued by the County Executive
18 under, pursuant to or in accordance with this Bill.

19 **SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL**
20 **OF HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that the Treasurer is hereby authorized and
21 empowered to prepare and distribute copies of the Documents to any person who may, in the
22 Treasurer’s judgment, be interested in participating in the financing of the Projects or who may
23 request the same or information with respect thereto; provided, however, that any preliminary

1 offering documents and related material shall be clearly marked to indicate that they are subject
2 to completion and amendment.

3 **SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL**
4 **OF HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that, to the extent the recordation tax and/or transfer
5 tax described in Section 2 of this Bill is insufficient to pay the principal of, premium (if any) and
6 interest on the bonds or other indebtedness herein authorized, when due and payable, the County
7 hereby covenants and agrees, with each of the holders, from time to time, of any of the bonds or
8 other indebtedness, that it shall promptly cause to be levied against all assessable property within
9 the County annually, so long as any of the bonds or other indebtedness is outstanding and not
10 paid, an *ad valorem* tax sufficient in rate and amount to provide for payment of such principal of,
11 premium (if any) and interest on the bonds or other indebtedness when due. Such tax shall be
12 levied in accordance with the Charter. The County, by the passage of this Bill, hereby covenants
13 and agrees properly and promptly to perform all of the respective acts and duties defined in the
14 Charter for the levy and collection of the aforesaid *ad valorem* tax upon all the assessable
15 property within the corporate limits of the County, as the levy and collection of such a tax
16 becomes necessary in order to provide for the payment of principal of, premium (if any) and
17 interest on the bonds or other indebtedness.

18 **SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL**
19 **OF HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that if the County Council determines by
20 administrative resolution or the County Executive determines by executive order, as the case may
21 be, that it is in the best interests of the County to sell any bonds or other indebtedness by private
22 (negotiated) sale, the County Council hereby authorizes (a) the appointment of an underwriter
23 (the "Underwriter") in connection with the sale thereof, and (b) the payment by the County to the
24 Underwriter out of the proceeds of the sale thereof or otherwise for services rendered in

1 connection therewith, such compensation to be determined by administrative resolution of the
2 County Council or executive order of the County Executive.

3 **SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL**
4 **OF HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that the County Executive is hereby authorized and
5 empowered for and on behalf of the County (a) to cause the preparation, printing, execution and
6 delivery of the Documents, each substantially in the form provided by administrative resolution
7 of the County Council or executive order of the County Executive, with such modifications,
8 supplements or amendments thereto as may be recommended by counsel; and (b) to do all such
9 things as may be necessary or desirable in the opinion of the County Executive in connection
10 therewith.

11 **SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL**
12 **OF HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that nothing herein contained shall authorize the
13 expenditure of County funds until such time as such expenditure shall have been appropriated by
14 the County Council and this Bill shall not be construed as authorizing or approving any project
15 not otherwise authorized or approved by all appropriate legal authorization.

16 **SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL**
17 **OF HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that unless changed by administrative resolution of
18 the County Council or executive order of the County Executive, if the indebtedness herein
19 authorized is evidenced by bonds: (a) the bonds shall be issued pursuant to the authority of this
20 Bill and shall be dated the date of issuance thereof; (b) the bonds shall be issued in the
21 denominations of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) or any integral multiple thereof (and the
22 amount of bonds to be issued by the County may be adjusted by administrative resolution of the
23 County Council or executive order of the County Executive so that each bond will be in a \$5,000
24 denomination, but in no event may the aggregate indebtedness incurred pursuant to this Bill

1 exceed Fifty-Five Million Five Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$55,580,000.00), and shall be
2 numbered from one (1) consecutively upward in the order of their maturities. The bonds shall
3 mature over a period not to exceed twenty (20) years from their date in not more than twenty (20)
4 installments beginning in the year 2021 and ending in the year 2040, unless changed by
5 administrative resolution of the County Council or executive order of the County Executive.
6 Unless changed by administrative resolution of the County Council or executive order of the
7 County Executive, the bonds shall mature on October 1 in each of said years as follows: Two
8 Million Seven Hundred Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$2,775,000.00) in each of the years
9 2021 through 2039, inclusive and Two Million Eight Hundred Fifty-Five Thousand Dollars
10 (\$2,855,000.00) in 2040. The term and maturity schedule of the bonds may be changed, increased
11 or decreased by administrative resolution of the County Council or executive order of the County
12 Executive, but the aggregate principal amount of indebtedness to be incurred shall not exceed
13 Fifty-Five Million Five Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$55,580,000.00).

14 **SECTION 11. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF**
15 **HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that if the indebtedness herein authorized is evidenced
16 by bonds, the bonds shall bear interest at the rate or rates named by the successful bidder for the
17 bonds in accordance with the Notice of Sale hereinafter set forth, as may hereafter be amended,
18 upon written recommendation of the County Executive, by administrative resolution of the
19 County Council, and said interest shall be payable semiannually on the first day of October and
20 April (or on such other dates as may be approved by administrative resolution of the County
21 Council or executive order of the County Executive) in each of the years that the bonds are
22 outstanding. Interest on the bonds will be payable by check or draft of the paying agent for the
23 bonds (the "Paying Agent") mailed to the registered owners thereof. The bonds, when issued,
24 shall be executed in the name of the County, by the facsimile (or original) signature of the

1 County Executive, and a facsimile (or original) of the corporate seal of the County shall be
2 imprinted or otherwise reproduced on each of the bonds attested by the facsimile (or original)
3 signature of the Director of Administration and the manual signature of an authorized officer of
4 the bond registrar for the bonds (the “Bond Registrar”). Such facsimiles and seal shall be
5 engraved, printed or lithographed or otherwise reproduced on each of the bonds in accordance
6 with, and pursuant to the authority of Sections 2-301 through 2-306 inclusive of the State
7 Finance and Procurement Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland (2015 Replacement
8 Volume and 2019 Supplement). If the indebtedness is evidenced by bonds, the bonds shall be
9 subject to registration as to principal and interest, in the name or names of the owner or owners
10 thereof on books kept for that purpose at the principal office of the Bond Registrar and the
11 principal of the bonds shall be payable upon presentation and surrender thereof at the principal
12 office of the Paying Agent or the ownership of the indebtedness may, pursuant to an
13 administrative resolution of the County Council or executive order of the County Executive, be
14 maintained by a book-entry system. The Bond Registrar and Paying Agent shall be determined
15 by administrative resolution of the County Council or executive order of the County Executive.
16 Payment of interest on the bonds shall be made by the Paying Agent on each payment date, to
17 each person appearing on the registration books of the County, maintained by the Bond Registrar,
18 as the registered owner thereof, by check or draft mailed to each such registered owner at his or
19 her address as it appears on such registration books. There shall be printed on each bond (or
20 delivered therewith) the text of the approving legal opinion of bond counsel with respect to the
21 bonds. Except as provided hereinafter or in an administrative resolution of the County Council

19 The issuance of the Bonds will be subject to delivery of the approving opinion of Miles & Stockbridge P.C.,
20 bond counsel, which opinion shall be substantially in the form set forth as an exhibit to the Preliminary Official
21 Statement referred to below.
22

23 **Official Statement**

24
25 Not later than seven (7) business days after the award of the Bonds to the successful bidder on the day of
26 sale, the County will deliver to the successful bidder an Official Statement, which is expected to be substantially in
27 the form of the Preliminary Official Statement referred to below. If so requested by the successful bidder at or
28 before the close of business on the date of the sale, the County will include in the Official Statement such pricing and
29 other information with respect to the terms of the reoffering of the Bonds by the successful bidder (“Reoffering
30 Information”), if any, as may be specified and furnished in writing by such bidder. If no Reoffering Information is
31 specified and furnished by the successful bidder, the Official Statement will include the interest rates on the Bonds
32 resulting from the bid of the successful bidder and the successful bidder shall be responsible to the County and its
33 officials for the Reoffering Information, and for all decisions made by such bidder with respect to the use or
34 omission of the Reoffering Information in any reoffering of the Bonds, including the presentation or exclusion of any
35 Reoffering Information in any documents, including the Official Statement. The successful bidder for the Bonds will
36 also be furnished, without cost, with a reasonable number of copies of the Official Statement (not to exceed 50
37 copies) and any amendments or supplements thereto. The successful bidder may order additional copies at its own
38 expense and is responsible for distributing the final Official Statement to its syndicate members.
39

40 The Preliminary Official Statement of the County concerning the Bonds (the “Preliminary Official
41 Statement”) is in a form “deemed final” by the County for purposes of Section (b)(1) of Rule 15c2-12 of the
42 Securities and Exchange Commission (the “Rule”), but is subject to revision, amendment and completion in the final
43 Official Statement. The County is distributing the Preliminary Official Statement to potential bidders electronically
44 through i-Deal LLC (“i-Deal”). Potential bidders may also obtain an electronic copy of the Preliminary Official
45 Statement by logging onto the website for i-Deal at www.i-dealprospectus.com. Prior to submitting a bid, each
46 potential bidder should read the Preliminary Official Statement in its entirety.
47

48 The County will undertake to provide the successful bidder with further additional information to be
49 included in the Official Statement, when in the opinion of the County or of Bond Counsel, such additional
50 information constitutes a material change to the Official Statement. The County will take such steps as are necessary
51 to arrange for amending and supplementing the Official Statement in connection with the disclosure of such
52 additional information; provided, however, that the County shall have no obligation to provide such additional

12 deliver to the County on or before the date of issue of the Bonds, an “issue price” or similar certificate setting forth

1 **SECTION 15. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF**
2 **HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that immediately after the sale of the bonds, the interest
3 rate or rates payable thereon shall be fixed by an administrative resolution of the County Council
4 or executive order of the County Executive in accordance with the terms and conditions of the
5 sale of the bonds. The bonds shall thereupon be suitably printed or engraved and duly executed
6 and delivered to the purchaser (or to the Depository Trust Company if the bonds are book entry)
7 in accordance with the conditions of delivery set forth in the Notice of Sale. The proceeds of the
8 sale of the bonds, including any premium and accrued interest received therefor, shall be paid to
9 the Department of the Treasury of the County and shall be deposited in a special account of the
10 County. The County may, at its option, deduct from the gross proceeds received from the sale of
11 the bonds the cost of issuing the same, including the cost of advertising, printing and professional
12 fees (including legal) and expenses. There shall be deducted from the total gross proceeds
13 received from the sale of the bonds the amount received on account of accrued interest (if any) on
14 the bonds, which amount shall be set apart by the Treasurer in a special fund and applied to the
15 first maturing interest payment on the bonds. The balance of the proceeds of the sale of the
16 bonds shall be expended only to finance the Projects as set forth in this Bill and as more
17 particularly described in the Annual Budget and Appropriation Ordinance of the County, as
18 amended, for the year ending June 30, 2021. If the funds derived from the sale of the bonds shall
19 exceed the amount needed to finance the Projects, the excess funds so borrowed and not
20 expended by the County shall be applied by the County in payment of the next principal maturity
21 of the bonds so issued, unless the County Council shall adopt a resolution or ordinance allocating
22 said excess funds to finance any lawful modification of the Projects, or to the extent then
23 permitted by law, any other project lawfully undertaken by the County, as may be provided by
24 subsequent resolution or ordinance approved by the County Council.

1 **SECTION 16. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF**
2 **HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that, to the extent the recordation and transfer taxes
3 described in Section 2 of this Bill are insufficient to pay the principal of, premium (if any) and
4 interest on the bonds, for the purpose of paying the interest on and principal of, premium (if any)
5 the bonds or other indebtedness authorized by this Bill, there is hereby levied and there shall
6 hereafter be levied in each fiscal year that any of the bonds or other indebtedness is outstanding,
7 *ad valorem* taxes on real and tangible personal property and intangible property subject to
8 taxation by the County without limitation on rate or amount; and, in addition, upon such other
9 intangible property as may be subject to taxation by the County within limitations prescribed by
10 law, in an amount sufficient together with funds available from other sources, to pay the annual
11 interest on the outstanding bonds or other indebtedness and to redeem the bonds or other
12 indebtedness maturing during the succeeding year; and the full faith and credit and the unlimited
13 taxing power of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the
14 principal of and interest on the bonds or other indebtedness as and when they mature. The
15 County by the passage of this Bill hereby covenants and agrees properly and promptly to perform
16 all of the respective acts and duties defined in this Bill for the levy and collection of the aforesaid
17 *ad valorem* tax upon all the assessable property within the corporate limits of the County, as the
18 levy and collection of such a tax becomes necessary in order to meet the debt service
19 requirements of the Harford County, Maryland General Consolidated Public Improvement
20 Bonds, Series 2021. By this Bill, the County agrees to take all action it may be legally authorized
21 and empowered to take in order to enforce, in any year in which any of the bonds or other
22 indebtedness are outstanding, the guarantee of such bonds or other indebtedness by the County.

23 **SECTION 17. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF**
24 **HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that as a part or all of the aggregate indebtedness

1 authorized by this Bill, upon written recommendation of the County Executive and adoption of
2 the Administrative Resolution (as defined in Section 17B of this Bill), the County shall borrow
3 upon its full faith and credit and unlimited taxing power of the County a loan (the “Water
4 Quality Loan”) from the Maryland Water Quality Financing Administration (the “WQFA”), and
5 shall issue and sell to the WQFA upon its full faith and credit and unlimited taxing power the
6 bonds in the form of a single, fully-registered bond in the principal amount not to exceed Six
7 Million Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$6,650,000.00) pursuant to the authority of the
8 Charter, the Code, the Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland, and Title 9
9 of the Environment Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland (2014 Replacement Volume and
10 2019 Supplement) (the “Water Quality Act”) for the upgrade, expansion and improvement of all
11 or part of the Storm Water Projects (defined in Section 17(C) below). The sale of the bonds shall
12 be conducted as more fully described in this Section 17 and the aggregate amount of bonds
13 otherwise authorized by this Bill shall be reduced by the amount of the bond sold pursuant to the
14 Water Quality Act. The County hereby determines to borrow money and incur indebtedness for
15 the public purpose of financing the costs of the acquisition and development of the Storm Water
16 Projects which shall include: (i) actual and estimated costs of the issuance of the bonds, (ii)
17 engineering expenses, (iii) inspection expenses, (iv) fiscal expenses, (v) legal expenses; and (vi)
18 interest estimated to accrue during the construction and for 24 months on money borrowed or
19 expected to be borrowed. The development costs shall be more fully described in the
20 Administrative Resolution. It is the intent of the County Council that the costs of the Storm
21 Water Projects be financed with the proceeds from the sale of the bonds and that the County also
22 be reimbursed out of the proceeds of the bonds for all costs of acquisition incurred by the
23 County; provided, however, that such expenses have been incurred by the County not more than
24 one (1) year prior to the issuance of the bonds:

1 A. Each of the Storm Water Projects shall constitute a “wastewater facility”
2 within the meaning of Section 9-1601 of the Water Quality Act.

3 B. Such borrowing and indebtedness of the County shall be made and incurred
4 pursuant to Section 9-1606 and Section 9-1614(b) of the Water Quality Act and in accordance
5 with the provisions of a loan agreement between the County, as borrower, and the WQFA (the
6 “Loan Agreement”). The Loan Agreement shall be substantially in such form as is approved by a
7 resolution supplemental to this Bill and passed subsequent to the enactment of this Bill (the
8 “Administrative Resolution”) which Administrative Resolution shall set forth the details of the
9 bonds and the terms of the loan, in such manner as shall not be inconsistent with the provisions
10 and requirements of this Bill. The Loan Agreement (the form of which shall be attached to the
11 Administrative Resolution and approved therein) shall contain in its final form such insertions,
12 omissions, variations, or changes (collectively “changes”) as may be deemed necessary or
13 appropriate and which shall be acceptable to the County Executive, and the County Executive is
14 hereby authorized, and shall be authorized by the Administrative Resolution, to make changes in
15 the Loan Agreement as the County Executive may deem appropriate.

16 C. The Projects that may be financed with the WQFA shall include all or a
17 portion of the following Projects as set forth in Section 1 of this Bill, and for purposes of a
18 possible bond issued pursuant to the Loan Agreement with the WQFA are herein referred to as
19 the “Storm Water Projects:”

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D. To evidence the payment of obligations of the County under the Loan Agreement, the County shall issue and sell, upon its full faith and credit and unlimited taxing power, the bonds, as general obligation installment bonds in the maximum amount not to exceed Six Million Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$6,650,000) which shall be in the form of one bond certificate numbered R-1 and shall be designated “Harford County, Maryland Water Quality Bond, Series 2021.”

The proceeds from the sale of the bonds shall be generally used for the purposes set forth in this Section 17 as more fully described in the project description as set forth and approved by the Administrative Resolution. The bonds shall be (i) dated as of the date of delivery to the WQFA, (ii) registered in the name of the WQFA or its designee and (iii) payable in such principal installments and shall bear interest at such rate as shall appear in the executed bond certificate. The maturity of the bonds and the date of final maturity shall appear in the executed bond certificate. In no event shall the final date of maturity of the bonds exceed thirty (30) years from the date of issuance thereof. The interest rate borne by the bonds shall be determined by the WQFA and approved in the Administrative Resolution.

The principal installments payable on the bonds and the rate of interest to be borne thereby (or the manner of determining the principal payments and rate of interest) shall be established by the Administrative Resolution. Such determination of the principal and interest on the bonds shall be in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Loan Agreement. The rate of interest approved by the Administrative Resolution shall in no event exceed the maximum rate permitted by law and such interest rate shall appear in the executed bond certificate.

The form of bond, together with the statement of principal installments (annual or

1 semiannual as shall be finally approved by the County Executive pursuant to this Section 17) and
2 such installments of interest as therein set forth, and all of the covenants and conditions as shall
3 be contained therein and in the Loan Agreement shall be adopted by the County Council pursuant
4 to the Administrative Resolution and any and all covenants and conditions therein contained
5 shall be made binding upon the County, including (without limitation) the promise to pay.
6 Execution of the bond by the County Executive shall constitute conclusive evidence of such
7 approval.

8 E. The County will also execute and deliver in connection with the issuance of
9 the bonds, additional documents (the “Water Quality Documents”) including, but not limited to,
10 the Loan Agreement, and such other documents, agreements, instruments and certificates as the
11 County Executive, upon advice of legal counsel, shall deem necessary or desirable for the
12 financing of the acquisition of the Storm Water Projects. Because this Bill is being adopted
13 before all of the details of the sale of the bonds and the issuance and sale of revenue bonds by the
14 WQFA the proceeds of which shall be used to make the Water Quality Loan to the County have
15 been finalized, the County Executive, pursuant to the powers reserved unto him under this
16 Section 17 and as set forth in the Administrative Resolution, is hereby authorized to make
17 changes to the forms of the bonds and the Water Quality Documents, including insertions
18 therein or additions thereto or deletions therefrom, as the County Executive may deem necessary
19 to conform the terms of the bonds and the Water Quality Documents to the terms of the financing
20 to be provided to the County by the WQFA; provided, however, that such changes, additions or
21 deletions are not in substance inconsistent with or contrary to the requirements set forth in this
22 Bill or in the Administrative Resolution.

23 F. The Loan Agreement and the bond shall be executed on behalf of and in the
24 name of the County by the County Executive, such execution to be made by the manual or

1 facsimile signature of the County Executive as permitted by law. The corporate seal of the
2 County shall be affixed to or otherwise reproduced on the Loan Agreement and the bonds, and
3 shall be attested by the manual or facsimile signature of the Director of Administration as
4 permitted by law. If any officer whose signature shall appear on the bond or the Water Quality
5 Documents shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of the bonds or the Water Quality
6 Documents, such signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as
7 if such officer had remained in office until such delivery. The County Executive is hereby
8 authorized, empowered and directed to complete the forms of the bonds and the Water Quality
9 Documents as such forms may be approved by the County Council through the Administrative
10 Resolution and the County Executive shall make corrections or changes thereto in any manner
11 which the County Executive, in the County Executive's discretion, shall deem necessary to
12 complete the issuance and sale of the bonds and the execution and delivery of the Water Quality
13 Documents, all as may promote the objectives of the County as set forth in this Bill. The Water
14 Quality Documents and the bonds, as executed by the County Executive and attested and sealed
15 as described above, shall be valid and legally binding obligations of the County in accordance
16 with their terms.

17 G. Notwithstanding any section of the Charter, the Code, Section 19-205 of the
18 Local Government Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland (2013 Replacement Volume and
19 2019 Supplement) or any other provision of public general or public local law, charter or
20 ordinance, and as authorized by Section 9-1606 of the Water Quality Act, the bonds may be sold
21 at private sale to the WQFA, without public bidding or regard to any limitations on the
22 denomination thereof and at any interest or cost or at any price that the County considers
23 necessary or desirable, and such private sale is determined to be in the best interests of the
24 County. The details of the sale of the bonds shall be determined in accordance with the

1 Administrative Resolution. The bonds shall be sold for cash at not less than par in accordance
2 with the terms and provisions of this Bill and the Administrative Resolution. The County
3 Executive, in the County Executive’s discretion, is expressly authorized and empowered to take
4 any and all action necessary to complete and close the award, sale and delivery of the bonds to
5 the WQFA, including (without limitation) making changes to the form of bond as the County
6 Executive may deem to be necessary or appropriate to comply with WQFA practices and policies
7 applicable from time to time; provided, however, that such actions taken by the County
8 Executive shall not be in substance inconsistent with or contrary to the provisions of this Bill or
9 the Administrative Resolution.

10 H. The proceeds of sale of the bonds to the WQFA shall be held, invested and
11 administered by the WQFA pursuant to the Loan Agreement and shall be used, when and as
12 required, to be applied from time to time as and when received by the County to finance costs of
13 the Storm Water Projects in compliance with the provisions of the Loan Agreement, the Charter,
14 the Code and the Water Quality Act. Any balance of the proceeds of the Water Quality Loan
15 remaining subsequent to payment in full of all the costs of the Storm Water Projects may be
16 applied to reduce the principal of the Water Quality Loan in accordance with the terms of the
17 Loan Agreement.

18 I. For the purpose of paying the principal of, premium (if any) and interest on the
19 bond when due, the County has established or shall establish a dedicated source of revenues as
20 shall be described in the Loan Agreement. In the event such revenues are insufficient to meet the
21 debt service requirements in any fiscal year in which the bonds are outstanding, the County shall
22 levy in such fiscal year upon all real and tangible personal property within its jurisdictional limits
23 subject to assessment for unlimited County taxation *ad valorem* taxes in rate and amount
24 sufficient to provide for the prompt payment of such principal, premium (if any) and interest on

1 the bonds in such fiscal year, and, if the proceeds from the collection of taxes so levied in any
2 such fiscal year are inadequate for such payment, additional taxes shall be levied in the
3 succeeding fiscal year to make up such deficiency. The full faith and credit and unlimited taxing
4 power of the County are hereby irrevocably pledged to the payment of the principal of, premium
5 (if any) and interest on the bonds as and when they become due and payable and to the levy and
6 collection of the taxes hereinabove described as and when such taxes may become necessary in
7 order to provide sufficient funds to meet the debt service requirements of the bonds. The County
8 hereby covenants and agrees with the registered owner of the bonds to levy and collect the taxes
9 hereinabove described and to take any action that may be appropriate from time to time during
10 the period that the bonds remain outstanding and unpaid to provide the funds necessary to pay
11 promptly the principal and interest due thereon.

12 J. The bonds are being issued in connection with the WQFA's Maryland Water
13 Quality Revolving Loan Fund Program and will evidence the County's obligation to repay the
14 Water Quality Loan advanced from the proceeds of the sale of revenue bonds issued by the
15 WQFA. The Loan Agreement limits the ability of the County to prepay the bond in accordance
16 with restrictions upon the ability of the WQFA to redeem its revenue bonds. Accordingly, the
17 County may prepay the bonds only in accordance with the provisions of the Loan Agreement and
18 the terms governing prepayment as set forth in the bonds.

19 K. The County Executive shall be the certifying official for the County
20 responsible for the execution and delivery on the date of the issuance of the bonds of a tax and
21 arbitrage certificate of the County (the "Tax Certificate") that complies with the requirements of
22 Section 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the applicable regulations
23 thereunder ("Section 148"). The County Executive is hereby authorized and directed to execute
24 and deliver the tax and arbitrage certificate to counsel rendering an opinion on the excludability

1 from gross income of interest on the bonds for purposes of federal income taxation on the date of
2 the issuance thereof. The Tax Certificate shall set out the reasonable expectations of the County
3 as to relevant facts, estimates and circumstances relating to the use of the proceeds of the bonds
4 or of any moneys, securities or other obligations to the credit of any account of the County which
5 may be deemed to be bond proceeds under Section 148. The County covenants with the
6 registered owner of the bonds that the facts, estimates and circumstances set forth in the Tax
7 Certificate will be based on the County’s reasonable expectations on the date of the issuance of
8 the bonds and will be, to the best of the certifying official’s knowledge, true, correct and
9 complete as of that date.

10 L. The County covenants and agrees with the registered owner of the bonds that it
11 will not make, or (to the extent that it exercises control or direction) permit to be made, any use
12 of the bond proceeds that would cause any bond to be an “arbitrage bond” within the meaning of
13 Section 148. The County further covenants that it will comply with Section 148 to the extent
14 applicable to the bonds on the date of issuance thereof and which may subsequently lawfully be
15 made applicable to the bonds. The County further covenants that it shall make such use of the
16 proceeds of the bonds, to the extent possible regulate the investment of the proceeds thereof, and
17 take such other and further actions as may be required to maintain the excludability from gross
18 income, for federal income tax purposes, of interest on the bonds. All officers, employees and
19 agents of the County are hereby authorized and directed to take such actions, and to provide such
20 certificates of facts and estimates regarding the amount and use of the proceeds of the bonds, as
21 may be necessary or appropriate from time to time to comply with, or to evidence the County’s
22 compliance with, the covenants set forth in this Section 17.

23 M. The principal amount of the bonds to be sold to the WQFA pursuant to the Water
24 Quality Act shall be determined in a resolution adopted by the County Council upon written

1 recommendation of the County Executive and shall constitute a portion or all of the Six Million
2 Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$6,650,000) principal amount of indebtedness authorized
3 to be incurred pursuant to this Bill, to finance all or a portion of the costs of the Storm Water
4 Projects. In no event may the aggregate indebtedness incurred by the County pursuant to this Bill
5 to finance the Storm Water Projects exceed Six Million Six Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
6 (\$6,650,000).

7 **SECTION 18. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF**
8 **HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that the County is hereby authorized and empowered
9 from time to time to issue its bond anticipation notes (or other evidence of indebtedness) on the
10 full faith and credit and unlimited taxing power of the County in an amount not exceeding Fifty-
11 Five Million Five Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$55,580,000.00), the net proceeds of such
12 sale to be used to finance part or all of the cost of the Projects; the sale of such notes to be upon
13 such terms as may be directed by resolution of the County Council.

14 The Treasurer prior to the issuance of any bond anticipation notes or other evidence of
15 indebtedness of the County shall present the terms of such notes to the County Council for
16 approval by administrative resolution of the County Council prior to the issuance thereof.

17 The bond anticipation notes will bear interest at the rate or rates so negotiated by the
18 Treasurer and approved by administrative resolution of the County Council and the bond
19 anticipation notes when issued shall be issued in the name of the County by the signature of the
20 County Executive, the corporate seal of the County shall be imprinted or otherwise reproduced
21 on the bond anticipation notes and attested by the Director of Administration and shall be used
22 only for those purposes approved by administrative resolution of the County Council adopted
23 subsequent to the adoption of this Bill.

1 The bond anticipation notes shall not be issued in an amount greater than the amount of
2 bonds or other indebtedness authorized in anticipation of the sale of which the bond anticipation
3 notes are issued and sold.

4 The principal of and interest on the bond anticipation notes shall be payable out of the
5 first proceeds of sale of the bonds, or from the tax or other revenue which the County shall
6 previously determine to apply to the payment of the bonds and interest thereon.

7 Twelve (12) months interest on the bond anticipation notes or any renewal thereof may be
8 paid from the proceeds of sale of the bonds accounting from the initial date of issue thereof.

9 By administrative resolution of the County Council, the County may provide for the
10 renewal of the bond anticipation notes at maturity with or without resale.

11 Immediately after the sale of the bond anticipation notes and approval by resolution of the
12 County Council, the proceeds of sale of such bond anticipation notes, after payment of expenses
13 of issuing the same, shall be paid to the County's Department of the Treasury. The proceeds of
14 sale of the bond anticipation notes shall be expended only to finance the Projects.

15 **SECTION 19. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF**
16 **HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that pursuant to Treasury Regulations 1.150-2,
17 governing the use of bond proceeds for the purpose of reimbursing expenditures paid prior to the
18 issuance of bonds, and as permitted by Treasury Regulations 1.150-2(e)(1), the Treasurer is
19 hereby duly designated to make declarations of Official Intent on behalf of the County. The
20 County expects that all or a part of the capital expenditures for the Projects will be paid prior to
21 the issuance of the bonds authorized herein, and that the proceeds of the bonds will be used to
22 reimburse the County for capital expenditures paid prior to the issuance of the bonds. The
23 County reasonably expects to reimburse a portion of the capital expenditures for the Projects
24 with proceeds of the bonds, in the maximum principal amount of Fifty-Five Million Five

1 Hundred Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$55,580,000.00), and this Bill shall be available for public
2 inspection at the offices of the County during regular business hours and in accordance with the
3 laws of the State of Maryland and the County, regarding access to public records. The maximum
4 principal amount of debt which is expected to be issued for the Projects is \$55,580,000.00.

5 **SECTION 20. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF**
6 **HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that the County covenants and agrees with the registered
7 owners, from time to time, of the bonds as follows:

8 (a) The County covenants that it will not make any use of the proceeds of any of
9 the bonds or any moneys, securities or other obligations on deposit to the credit of the County or
10 otherwise which may be deemed by the Internal Revenue Service to be proceeds of any of the
11 bonds pursuant to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and Income Tax Regulations
12 thereunder (collectively, the “Tax Code”), which would cause any of the bonds to be “arbitrage
13 bonds” or “private activity bonds” within the meaning of the Tax Code.

14 (b) The County further covenants that it will comply with those provisions of the
15 Tax Code that are applicable to the bonds on the date of issuance thereof and which may
16 subsequently lawfully be made applicable thereto. To the extent that provisions of the Tax Code
17 apply to only a portion of the bonds, proceeds of the bonds or other moneys, securities or other
18 obligations deemed to be proceeds, it is intended that the covenants of the County contained in
19 this Section 20 be construed so as to require the County to comply with the provisions of the Tax
20 Code only to the extent of such applicability.

21 (c) The County further covenants that it will not (i) take any action, (ii) fail to
22 take any action, or (iii) make any use of the proceeds of any of the bonds which would cause the
23 interest on any of the bonds to be or become subject to federal income taxes in the hands of the
24 registered owners of any of the bonds.

1 (d) The County further covenants, in order to assist bidders in complying with
2 SEC Rule 15c2-12(b)(5), pursuant to a continuing disclosure agreement (the “Continuing
3 Disclosure Agreement”) signed by the County Executive, Treasurer and Director of
4 Administration, to provide annual reports and notices of certain events. The undertaking of the
5 County in the Continuing Disclosure Agreement shall be described in any Preliminary Official
6 Statement and Official Statement and any amendment or supplement thereto.

7 **SECTION 21. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF**
8 **HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that upon recommendation of the County Executive, the
9 County Council may adopt a resolution pursuant to Section 19-101 of the Local Government
10 Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland (2013 Replacement Volume and 2019 Supplement)
11 authorizing the loan authorized to be incurred and the bonds authorized to be sold by this Bill, to
12 be consolidated for sale and issued, sold and delivered as a single issue of bonds with other
13 bonds authorized to be sold to finance capital projects described in the Annual Budget and
14 Appropriation Ordinances, as amended, for the current fiscal year and/or prior or subsequent
15 fiscal years.

16 **SECTION 22. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF**
17 **HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that the provisions of this Bill are severable, and if any
18 provision, sentence, clause, section or part hereof is held illegal, invalid or unconstitutional or
19 inapplicable to any person or circumstances, such illegality, invalidity or unconstitutionality, or
20 inapplicability shall not affect or impair any of the remaining provisions, sentences, clauses,
21 sections or parts of this Bill or their application to other persons or circumstances. It is hereby
22 declared to be the legislative intent that this Bill would have been passed if such illegal, invalid
23 or unconstitutional provision, sentence, clause, section or part had not been included herein, as if

1 the person or circumstances to which this Bill or any part hereof are inapplicable had been
2 specifically exempted therefrom.

3 **SECTION 23. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL**
4 **OF HARFORD COUNTY, MARYLAND** that this Bill shall take effect sixty (60) calendar
5 days from the date it becomes law.
