

Super Spy Adventures; Chapter 5 - Morse Code

All spies know how to send secret messages in code. There are lots of codes used in the spy world, and you can even make your own secret code. We will get to that!

But first, let's start with a well-known code – Morse Code.

MORSE CODE

Morse Code uses dots and dashes to represent the letters of the alphabet that we all know. You can write out a message on paper, or send a sound message, or even send a message across the room silently with light!

Use Sounds - like tapping on the table with your pen or beating on a drum.

Use Light by turning a flashlight on and off.

A DOT is a short sound or flash of light and looks like a small dot or short line when you write it.

A DASH is a long (3 dots in length) sound or long flash of light, or a long line (3 times the length of the dot or short line) when you write it.

You use these dots and dashes to represent the letters in a word.

Learn Morse Code

You can write Morse code, or send it via sounds or lights.
Dots represent a short sound or light, and dashes a long sound or light.
