
# Free recycling for your Christmas tree & lights; Household Hazardous Waste collection

Remember you can recycle your live Christmas tree for free at our Harford Waste Disposal Center locations: 3139 Scarboro Road in Street, from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday through Saturday; and the Tollgate Drop Off site at 703 N. Tollgate Road in Bel Air on Saturdays only from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m. Please remove all decorations and lights prior to drop-off. We also accept Christmas lights, clothing, textiles, electronics and more at no charge. And mark your calendar for our next Household Hazardous Waste Day collection on Tuesday, Feb. 2 from 8 a.m. to noon. Visit our recycling webpage for more information or call 410-638-3417.



## Lifesaving addition to county trails

As a former volunteer EMT, I know that emergencies can happen anywhere, even when you're out for a hike or run. That's why we've installed these yellow boxes along several county trails, containing an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) for cardiac arrest, and a Stop the Bleed kit. For access in an emergency, first call 911. If there's a box near you, you'll be directed to send someone to its location and call 911 upon their arrival. The 911 dispatcher will then provide the access code to open the box and further instructions for using this lifesaving equipment. Boxes have been installed at the Ma & Pa Trail, Schucks Regional Park, Mariner Point Park and Friends Park, and more are coming soon to other locations countywide.


