The FY22 Budget Public Hearing (May 3, 2021) will be hosted in the Council Chambers. Due to the ongoing health emergency relating to COVID-19 the guidelines listed below will be enforced for the public health and safety of all.

The meeting will be open to the public however, to ensure compliance with the Governor's order capacity and seating will be significantly limited. A face mask is required to enter the building and must be worn for the duration of your time in the building. - 6. Email**
