Harford School Board Applications Open Until January 13

The essential work of educating Harford County children is overseen locally by the school board. Thanks to state legislation approved last year, school board membership is now completely under local control. Previously, three of Harford County's school board members were appointed by the governor, but from now on they will be appointed by the County Executive, approved by the County Council, and serve alongside the six elected members. TAX CREDIT

for qualifying seniors & veterans

Tax Credit for Qualifying Seniors & Veterans

Harford County's senior tax credit allows eligible seniors and qualified veterans to receive a 20% credit on their county property taxes for a total of 20 years. Homeowners who are military veterans with service-related disabilities and their surviving spouses are eligible at any age. All other recipients must be 65 or older and have lived in the same house for 35 years, or have retired from the U.S. uniformed services, or be the surviving spouse of a qualifying retired veteran. The assessed home value for all applicants must be \$600,000 or less. Details and **applications will be posted online this month** and are due by April 1, 2023.

If our snowplows cannot fit between parked cars, the street does not get plowed.
