OBJECTIVE: Students will describe how the changes during puberty prepare the body for reproduction.

VOCABULARY: Puberty, Adolescence, Hygiene**MOTIVATION : Warm-Up**

Ask students the following question: What are some changes that take place during puberty? Have students share a few responses.

Lesson Procedures:

1. **Discussion:** Share the definitions for puberty, adolescence, and hygiene.
2. **Activity: Is Jordan a Boy or a Girl:** Students will complete the worksheet Is Jordan a Boy or a Girl? Students should decide on a gender and then explain why they chose that gender. Students should use information from the text to support their answer in the Once complete, have students share their response with their supporting detail.
3. **Activity: Puberty Checklist:** Provide students with the Puberty Checklist. Student can choose to work individually or work with a partner to determine which changes occur during puberty for

males, females or both genders. Students are not expected to know all this information, as they have not yet learned it this year.

4. **Student Puberty Checklist Review: Turn and Learn:** If students feel comfortable, have them share their responses with other students in the class.
5. **Discussion: Puberty Checklist:** Have students share their response with the class as you discuss the changes that take place in puberty. Have students make changes to their responses if necessary.
 - a. The PowerPoint is interactive, and each “x” will pop up in the correct column when clicked to move forward
