2. Identify the environmental impact and include a description/pictures.
3. Identify the human impact and include a description (pictures can be included when appropriate).

Topic C: What was the lesson learned:

1. Describe the things learned from the event.
2. Describe the actions being taken to prevent a future, similar event.
3. Describe (if any) the LONG-TERM impact (that still exist).

Upcycling is the opposite of downcycling, which is the other face of the recycling process.

Project Criteria:

1. Benefits to Upcycling (generic-overall benefit)
 - a. List 3
2. The product you intend to use for “upcycling”
 - a. It’s main/normal daily use/purpose
 - b. Your intended “upcycle” use/purpose
 - c. Benefit of your upcycle project
3. Step by step process/tutorial (How to) to complete the upcycle project

Educational Element:

1. Tutorial on HOW to upcycle your product
 - a. Create a “How to” Video
2. Digital “Instructible”
 - a. Create a digital resource to instruct others – use the information from your written outline to create your digital resource
3. Other graded components
 - a. Creativity of upcycled product
 - b. Usability of your upcycled product
