Sexting



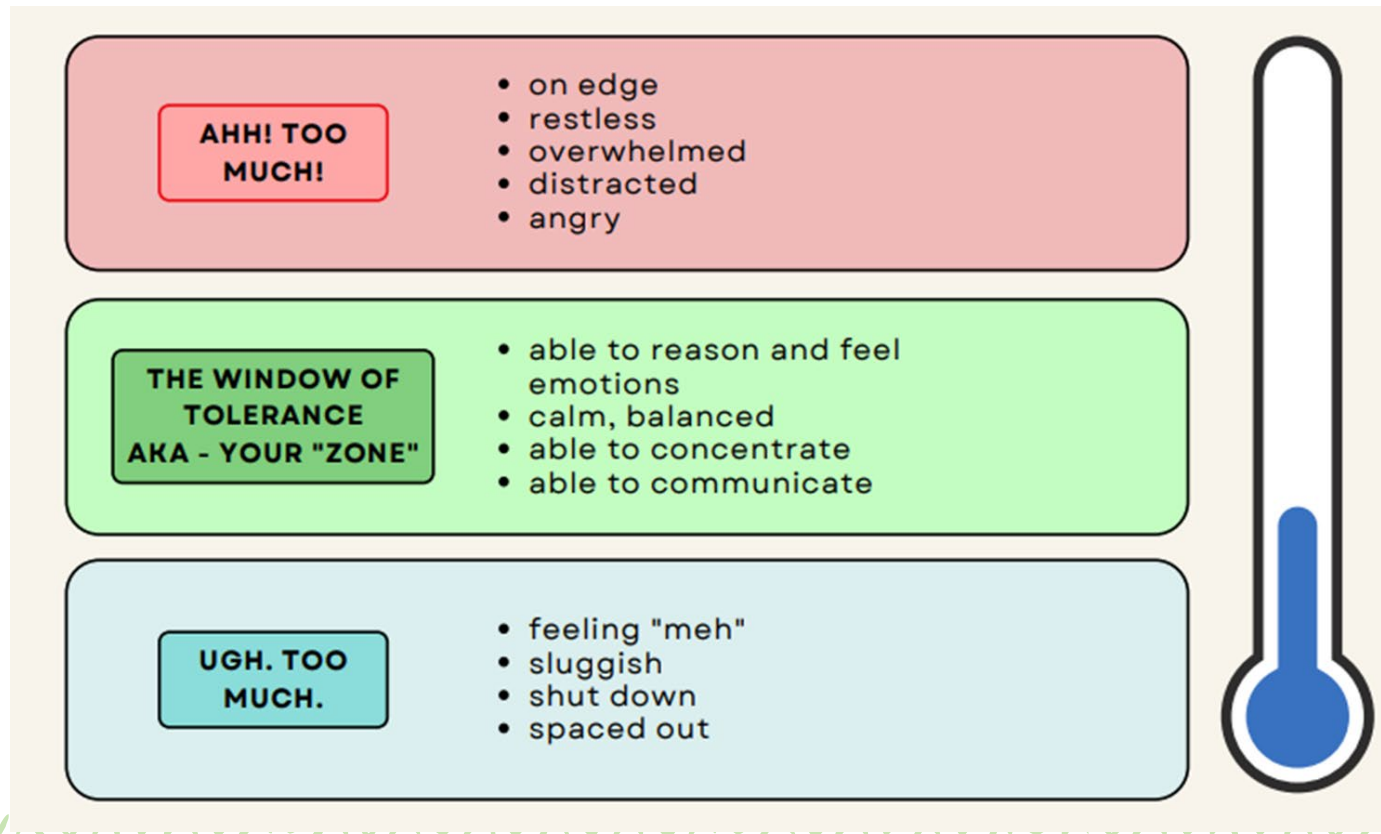

Outside sources such as people, places or things that impact our decision-making process

Internal Influences

Thoughts, feelings, values and beliefs that impact our decision-making process

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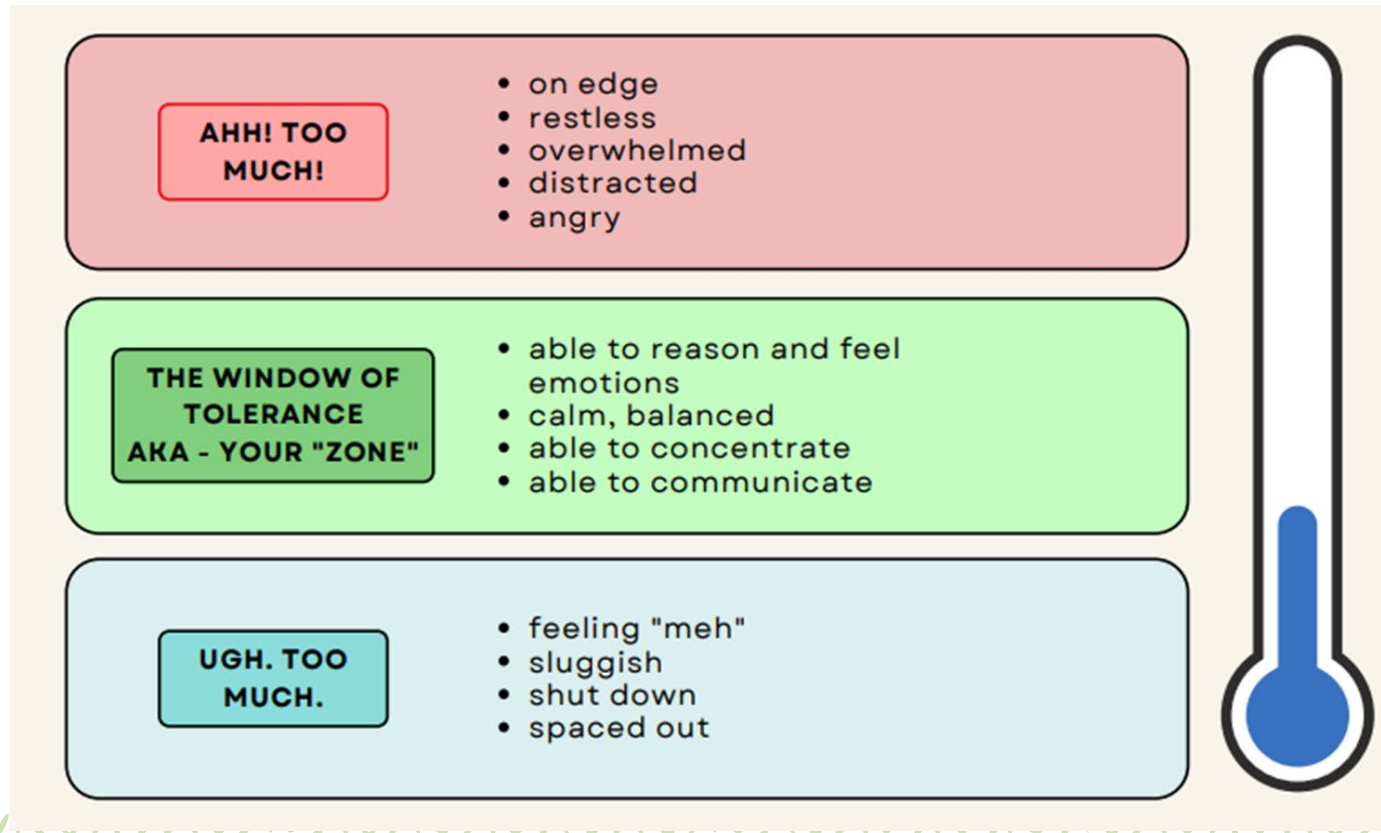

The Snap
