Brighter Roads Ahead: Harford County Upgrading Streetlights

Harford County recently secured a \$400,000 federal grant to replace approximately 500 older streetlights with new, brighter, and more energy-efficient LED bulbs. For neighborhoods in our southern county region, these LED lights will improve public safety and visibility at night. This project will begin in early 2026 and will save taxpayer money by cutting down on the county's electric and maintenance bills. [Read more](#)



New Funds Boost High School Tech Apprenticeships

Harford County Public Schools recently secured over \$117,000 to expand its high-school IT and cybersecurity apprenticeships. This funding directly supports high-tech programs like the P-TECH (Pathways in Technology Early College High School) program at Joppatowne High School which immerses students in both college coursework and work-based learning, allowing them to gain experience, earn a salary, and receive high school credit while preparing for top careers in Maryland's technology sector. US 40 Highway in Edgewood is Getting a \$950k Upgrade

Resurfacing and improvements are coming to US Route 40 (Pulaski Highway) and will encompass the section of road between MD 152 and MD 24 in Edgewood. This \$950,000 State Highway Administration project has already started and will run through mid-November. Drivers should expect periodic single-lane closures and plan for delays on weekdays from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and overnight Sunday through Thursday from 8 p.m. to 5 a.m.



Joppatowne High School Educator Earns National Teaching Excellence Award

Teacher Erica Richardson of Joppatowne High School has been named the Maryland recipient of the National Education Association (NEA) Foundation Travelers Award for Teaching Excellence for 2026. The award is given for excellence in the classroom, leadership as a teacher, community engagement and commitment to expanding opportunities for all through public education. Richardson credits her success to the strong support system from the Joppatowne community, her family, and the school's leadership, saying, "It's a hands-on, team effort." She is one of just 48 educators in the U.S. to receive this national honor.

Cunion Field in Edgewood Receives New Field Lighting

Cunion Field in Edgewood recently received an upgrade of portable lights to help light up the field at nighttime for the Edgewood Recreation Council activities including the Rams football and cheer and soccer recreation program. This upgrade allows players and coaches to practice safely at night, improving access for young athletes and encouraging mentoring relationships. The rental of these lights was funded from a grant through the Community Reinvestment and Repair Fund (CRRF) in support of youth programs and to improve the quality of life in priority areas like Edgewood.



Construction Underway on New Access Road to Copperplex Athletic Facility in Edgewood

Harford County has begun construction on a new connector road in Edgewood that will

reduce congestion on neighborhood streets and improve access to the Copperplex athletic facility on Cedar Drive. Once completed, Ivanhoe Street will directly connect Cedar Drive to Willoughby Beach Road. The \$1.26 million project is expected to be completed by summer of 2026.



Community Coach and Advocate Tyrone McKisset Adopts Local Court

Tyrone McKisset, former Edgewood High School basketball player and current coach has officially adopted his neighborhood basketball court located on Brookside Drive in Edgewood, ensuring that the court will be kept clean and remain a positive gathering place.
