Bridge Drive Maintenance Work Completed in Joppatowne

Bridge Drive in Joppatowne, between Towne Center Drive and Shore Drive, was reopened to all through traffic on December 3, following completion of maintenance on the bridge over the Gunpowder River. The \$300,000 project included routine maintenance on the bridge piers. A short-term closure is scheduled for spring 2026 to allow for deck cleaning and additional routine maintenance and will take about 3-4 weeks depending on weather conditions. 1,182 Fire Hydrants Reconditioned

Harford County is continuing its fire hydrant reconditioning program into the new year scheduling the final 366 hydrants to be sand blasted, primed and painted. To date, 1,182 of the existing 1,612 hydrants within the Southern County Taskforce area have been completed.



Aberdeen's Hall's Cross Roads Elementary Earns National Honor

Hall's Cross Roads Elementary has been named a 2025 National ESEA Distinguished School for exceptional growth making the school one of only two schools in Maryland to receive the award and one in less than 100 nationwide. The school was recognized as a 2025 Distinguished School for exceptional student performance and academic growth, specifically in reading. Halls Cross Roads has boosted its Maryland Star Rating from 2 Stars in 2022 to 4 Stars in 2024, maintaining a strong performance in 2025. For more information visit [here](#).

Harford Pushes Back Against Environmental Threat to Joppatowne

Harford County Executive Bob Cassilly has strongly urged the Maryland Department of the Environment to deny a request by Days Cove Rubble Landfill to double its allowable discharge into the Gunpowder River from 12,500 to 25,000 gallons per day. This requested increase could significantly raise pollutant levels in the Gunpowder River, impacting Joppatowne, which relies on this waterway. New Upgrades at Joppatowne Wastewater Treatment Plant

Plans have been made to upgrade the Joppatowne Wastewater Treatment plant to ensure safe wastewater treatment in compliance with evolving environmental regulations. Air compressors and blowers used in the treatment process will be replaced and a new system will be installed to reuse water treated at the plant for its internal processes. These improvements will ensure reliability and increased efficiency for plant operation. Bids are currently being solicited, and work is expected to be completed in 13 months.



Edgewood Middle School Students Brighten Edgewater Village

Students from Edgewood Middle School's Willpower Unleashed group rolled up their sleeves on Friday, November 21 to improve the Edgewater Village Shopping Center. Entryway curbs were painted and trash was removed, creating a cleaner, more welcoming space for the community. Seventh-grader Landon said, "It's important for young people to invest in their community." Well said, Landon!



Sewer Line Upgrades on Brookside Drive in Edgewood

Sewer line rehabilitation has begun along Brookside Drive, with 1,150 feet of sewer line and 53 connections renewed or repaired to date. Harford County Department of Public Works is working with a contractor using a method called “lining,” in which repairs are made by inserting a flexible liner that is hardened with ultraviolet light. This method also minimizes disruption to roads, sidewalks and yards. The improvements are expected to increase the life of the system by 50 – 60 years and prevent costly repairs. Please obey “No Parking” signs and expect to see contractor equipment from Pleasants during several short periods throughout 2026.
